"BEAUTIFUL FEET FOR THE GOSPEL"

With Isaiah 52:7 as our emphasis, 165 Native women came from throughout northeast Oklahoma and beyond to attend the LINK Women's Conference on April 2, 2022, held at Southeast Baptist Church, Muskogee, Oklahoma. The Native American LINK Executive Board worked diligently to provide a well-organized, meaningful experience for all who attended. Board Member Priscilla Arneecher (Cherokee) served as coordinator of planning sessions and moderated the conference. Norma Lee (Choctaw), LINK Board Secretary, shared the theme interpretation. Whitney Reed (Seminole-Muscogee) Native Praise Choir Member led the praise and worship. Donna Drew (Seminole) and a registered nurse brought an enlightening session, titled, "Good Health for the Gospel," promoting physical and spiritual readiness. Rev. Jay Mule (Choctaw), Director of Missions for the Cheyenne-Arapaho Baptist Association brought the message, "Going to the Harvest Field." Augusta Smith (Muscogee-Seminole) Executive Director of Native American LINK, shared "Steps to Effective Spiritual Leadership" in an afternoon session. Our final speaker was Rich Schaus, Executive Director of the Gospel Rescue Mission in Muskogee brought the Missions Emphasis. As a ministry project, the conferees brought specified items of new clothing that was distributed to the Gospel Rescue Mission, enough to fill the back of a pickup truck! Offering was taken to assist in bringing a conference to Western Oklahoma in the near future. All in all, 50 Oklahoma Baptist Churches and 19 tribal nations were represented. The conference was well-received with great fellowship among all the attendees. Our prayer is that our women will be encouraged and equipped to share the Gospel message to Native communities with effectiveness.
